60% of all civil lawsuits are related to some form of personal injury.

This is approximately 410,000 per year.

4% of personal injury cases actually go to trial.

Of cases that actually go to trial plaintiffs are successful in around 50% of the cases.

PERSONAL INJURY LAWSUIT AWARDS

Half of all plaintiffs receive no more than \$24,000.

The median award is \$31,000 for all cases.

The median award in **motor vehicle** personal injury cases is **\$16,000**.

Intentional tort cases have a median payout of \$100,000.

Medical malpractice cases pay out an average of \$679,000.



The court process for personal injury cases that actually go to trial is incredibly lengthy.

The average tort lawsuit is 23 months.

The average motor vehicle accident case is 20 months.

The average **medical malpractice case is 31 months.**

Settlement times can vary based on the **factors and complexity** of the case.
